
A library membership is essential to be able to access this content. To access this content for free, use the YPRL portal through our eLibrary Resources or our YPRL app.



3. Click on eResources at the top of the blue bar and scroll down to Digital Age - Library Edition





4. Click on View resource online. This will take you to the Digital Age portal homepage.




Home Page of The Age - Digital Newspaper.

This is the home page for The Age Digital Newspaper.



In **Browse**, you can select the year of publication by scrolling along the top. Once you select the year, you can select the month of release. The newspapers are orders 1 to 31 depending on the days of the month.



Reading Online/ Viewer

When reading online, there a few features to help improve this.

When you click on an article, it is highlighted yellow and is zoomed in larger for easier reading. To exit out of the article, click once on the zoomed in text.






Selecting Pages

There are a few things to help finding your favourite sections of the newspaper easier.

Sections: Found in the blue info bar, when you click on it gives you the contents list of the newspaper. Just click on the section you want to read and it take you there.

Thumbnails: Found next to sections, this gives a smaller view of the newspaper, allowing you to flick fast through it until you get to the page you want.

Page: Next to the arrow and zoom buttons in the blue info bar, you can type in a page number.




Searching in the digital archives

You have several options for searching through The Age Digital Archives.

You can search for Articles, Pictures or Ads sorted by Relevance, Newest or Oldest.

By refining your search, you can narrow your search field to front pages only, Byline contents, exclude words from your search limits, use exact words or phrases, search for all or any of your search terms. You can also limit the search dates.






My Collection

When you have found an article you like during searching, you have an option to 'Add to my collection'

My Collection stores saved articles from your searching.




There are 2 ways to delete an article.

- The trash can will delete all saved articles.
- On each article, there is a small cross at the top left hand corner. You can manually delete articles using it.

In My Collection, you have the option to email the article.

When you have your article open, click the mail icon (gray envelope).



A box like this will open up. Click on the blue text. This will push the article to open in an email on your computer's email server. Then you fill out the details on the email and click send.






Accessing through YPRL's app:


1. To begin, download YPRL's app, Yarra Plenty Regional Library from Apple's App Store or Android's Google Play Store.

For help on installing an app on an Android device, see our resource guide "How to download an Android App".

2. Open the app and sign in to your library account or join as a new library member.



3. Click on eLibrary. Our eResources are divided into categories: Read, Watch, Listen, Learn, Play, Research and an A - Z eResource list of all our eResources.



4. Click on the eResource that you want to open.

5. The eResource will open in web browser, similar to when accessing the resource through YPRL's web page. You will be able to discover all the key features of this guide through the web browser portal, including how to set up your account.
